25th Annual Meeting of the MidSouth APMS will be Held in Orange Beach, Alabama

The 25th Annual Meeting of the MidSouth Aquatic Plant Management Society will be held October 24-26, 2006, at the Perdido Beach Resort in Orange Beach, Alabama. The Perdido Beach Resort is the premier resort of Alabama's Gulf Coast, located directly on the sugar-white beaches and emerald waters of the Gulf of Mexico.

The meeting program is near completion with many topics of interest including chemical control methods, biological control methods, wildlife interactions, and several other topics of interest in the aquatics industry. Student presenters will provide up-to-date findings of their research work. In addition, industry representatives will exhibit available aquatic plant management products and professional services.

The meeting will get kicked off with the Welcoming Social on Tuesday evening with entertainment provided by our own Troy Goldsby; this is an excellent time to reacquaint with old friends and meet new ones. The technical program will begin Wednesday morning and end at noon on Thursday. The Banquet on Wednesday evening will be a memorable event featuring great food and beverage.

Hotel Reservations. To reserve your hotel accommodations, call Perdido Beach Resort reservations at 800-634-8001. You must make your reservation before September 24, 2006, and be sure to mention that you are participating in the 25th Annual Meeting of the MidSouth Aquatic Plant Management Society. Our special guest room rate is \$85.00 single or double occupancy per night plus applicable tax, currently 11%. A \$10.00 surcharge will be applied to each third and fourth adult occupying a room. All reservations must be guaranteed with a major credit card. Cancellation of reservations must be made at least 72 hours prior to arrival date. At check-in, reconfirm your departure date, as an early departure fee of 50% of one night's room and tax will be assessed to the guest's account if changed after the check-in process is completed. Check-in time is 4:00 p.m., and check-out time is 12:00 p.m.

Proposed Bylaws Amendment

In accordance with the MSAPMS Bylaws, the proposed amendment is provided to the active members and will be voted upon at the MSAPMS business meeting in Orange Beach, AL, October 26, 2006. The Board of Directors has approved significant changes to the Bylaws for the effective organization of content, format and style, and correctness of grammar. PDF copies of the current Bylaws (October 26, 2001) and proposed amended Bylaws (October 26, 2006) are being e-mailed to you with this Newsletter so that you may review these changes. In addition, the Board of Directors has approved the following specific changes that affect the meaning of the Bylaws. Please review the following list and the copies of the Bylaws, and be prepared to discuss and vote on this amendment at our business meeting.

ARTICLE IV

- Section A, 2nd sentence - changed “classes” to “categories”
- Section A. a) (changed a to 1.) - changed “Full Member” to “Individual Member”
- Section A. b) (changed b to 2.), 1st sentence - changed “student.” to “student who is interested in the advancement of the Society and its goals.”
- Section A. d) (changed d to 4.), 2nd sentence - changed “members” to “individual members”
- Section A. d) (changed d to 4.), 2nd & 3rd sentences - deleted “except that of holding office. Sustaining members shall have one (1) vote cast by a duly authorized delegate.”
- Section A. e) (changed e to 5.), added 5.e., 3rd & 4th sentences - deleted “and upon acceptance of nominees by the Board, a biographical sketch of the nominees will be prepared. The Board of Directors shall, at the next meeting, present the nominee to the Society.” Changed 5th sentence to read “Honorary membership shall be approved by a majority vote of the Board of Directors.”
- Section B - changed “All full, retired, and honorary members shall have the right to vote.” with “Voting Privileges. All Individual, Student, Retired, Honorary, Charter, and one designated representative from a Sustaining Membership who are members in good standing with current, paid-up dues shall have the right to vote.”
- Added “Section C. Membership Dues. Dues amount for each membership category shall be proposed by the Board of Directors and voted upon by the membership at the Annual Business Meeting. Annual dues are due by the first full day of the annual meeting to qualify for the full rights and

privileges of membership in that calendar year.” and deleted Article XI, “Membership dues shall be payable in advance and shall in no case be paid later than the first day of the annual meeting. Annual dues shall be as follows: Full members \$10.00; Student members \$5.00; retired members \$5.00; Sustaining members \$50.00; and Honorary members, none.”

ARTICLE V

- Section A, 1st sentence - changed “Officers of the Society shall be: (a) President, (b) President-Elect, (c) Secretary, (d) Treasurer, (e) Editor.” to “The officers of the Society shall be the President, President Elect, Secretary, Treasurer, Editor, and Immediate Past President.”
- Section B - changed 1st sentence “The President shall preside at all membership and Board meetings; shall, in consultation with the Board of Directors, appoint all committee chairmen, and shall perform all other duties incidental to the office.” to 2 sentences “The President shall preside at all business meetings (annual and special), and at all meetings of the Board of Directors. The President shall, in consultation with the Board of Directors, appoint all committee chairs, and shall perform all other duties incidental to the office.”
- Added “Section E. Treasurer.”
- Section E, 2nd sentence - changed “\$100.00” to “\$300.00”
- Section E, 5th sentence - changed “Auditing Committee” to “Internal Audit Committee”
- Changed “Section E” to “Section F. Editor”
- Added “Section G. Immediate Past President. The Immediate Past President shall serve as an advisor to the President and Board of Directors and shall serve as Chair of the Nominating Committee. This officer shall perform such duties as specified herein and as may be assigned by the President or the Board of Directors.
- Added Section H. Directors. The four (4) directors shall assist in administering the affairs of this Society.
- Changed “Section F” to “Section I. Term of Office”
- Section I, 1st sentence - changed “The President and President-Elect serve” to “The President, President Elect, and Immediate Past President serve”
- Section I, 4th sentence - changed “Directors, with the exception of the immediate past-president, are elected to a two (2) year term of office, and may be elected for a consecutive term, but then must relinquish said office of Director for a like period of time equal to their term of office.” to “Two (2) directors shall be elected each year for a two (2) year term of office, and may be elected for a consecutive term, but then must relinquish said

office of Director for a like period of time equal to their term of office.”

- Section I - deleted 5th sentence
- Combined Sections G, H, and I to “*Section J. Election of Officers*”

ARTICLE VI

- Deleted “Section A”
- Changed “Sections B, C, & D” to “Sections A, B, & C”
- Section A - changed “Chairman” to “Chair”
- Section B, 6th sentence - changed “meet no less than two (2) times annually.” to “meet no less than three (3) times annually.”
- Section B, 7th sentence - changed “One meeting shall be held immediately before the annual meeting of the Society and one meeting immediately after the annual meeting.” to “One meeting shall be held immediately before the annual meeting of the Society; one meeting shall be held immediately after the annual meeting of the Society; and one additional meeting shall be held during the interim between the annual meetings.”
- Section B - deleted 8th sentence

- Changed “A quorum for any meeting” to “A quorum of the business meeting”
