

## 26th Annual Meeting of the MSAPMS Nashville, TN



The 47th Annual Meeting of the Aquatic Plant Management Society will be held July 15-18, 2007, at the Gaylord Opryland Resort & Convention Center in Nashville, Tennessee. The MidSouth Chapter will be our host this year and will hold their 26th Annual Meeting in conjunction with the national society. The Gaylord Opryland Resort & Convention Center offers nine acres of gardens, winding rivers and pathways, and waterfalls under climate-controlled glass atriums where you can shop, dine, and be entertained. Our hotel is also within walking distance of Nashville's

most popular tourist attraction, the legendary Grand Ole Opry. Other Nashville attractions and activities include: dinner cruising the Cumberland River aboard the General Jackson Showboat, the State Capitol, the Parthenon, Belmont Mansion, Belle Meade Plantation, Music Row, the Country Music Hall of Fame and much, much more...

The Program Committee is preparing an exemplary meeting certain to peak the interest of all delegates. The technical program will begin on Monday morning and end at noon on Wednesday, with a poster session on Monday evening. The Program promises to be diverse and interesting with excellent oral and poster presentations on research and management activities. A special session and panel discussion on the impacts of invasive plants on threatened and endangered species is planned. In addition, useful information on available aquatic plant management products and professional services will be provided throughout the meeting in our industry exhibits hall.

The Meeting Planning Committee is busy arranging a number of exciting special events for all attendees to enjoy. Our meeting will kick off with a President's Reception on Sunday evening. As the official welcoming event of the meeting, this reception is an excellent time to reacquaint with old friends, meet new friends, and just relax and enjoy great food and beverage. The APMS Banquet on Tuesday evening will be another memorable event where we will recognize those who have served and contributed to our Society, welcome new officers and directors, and present student paper and other awards. The Banquet will conclude with a special evening of country music featuring some of Nashville's most talented singers and songwriters. You won't want to miss it! All special events are free to registered delegates, students, and guests. Non-registered guests may purchase individual tickets for these events at the registration desk.

To make your hotel reservation, call the Gaylord Opryland Resort & Convention Center directly at (615) 883-2211. You must make your reservation on or before June 14, 2007 and be sure to mention the Aquatic Plant Management Society Annual Meeting or Group Code X-AQPM7. Our special APMS guest room rate is \$142.00 for single or double occupancy per night plus applicable tax, currently 14.25%. Each additional person to a room is \$20.00. Children 12 years and under are free when occupying the same room as their parents. Room rates are good for 3 days before and after the meeting, based on availability. A resort fee of \$10.00 will be charged per room per night and is subject to 9.25% sales tax. This fee includes high speed internet access, access to Cyber Café, local and toll-free calls up to 20 minutes, access to the fitness center, USA Today delivered daily (Monday-Friday), 2 bottles of water (refreshed daily), and scheduled complex transportation. Check-in time is 3:00 p.m. and checkout time is 11:00 a.m. All self-parking is \$10.00 per day and valet parking is \$18.00 plus tax per day.

The meeting registration fees are \$225.00 for delegates and \$100.00 for guests (spouse, partner, child over 12 years-of-age) if received by June 14, 2007. After this date, registration fees at the door will be \$275.00 for delegates and \$125.00 for guests. The meeting registration fee for students competing in the student paper contest (oral or poster) is waived and the registration fee for a student not competing is \$50.00. Delegate and student registration includes all technical sessions, President's Reception, refreshment breaks, Poster Reception, and Banquet. Guest registration includes President's Reception, refreshment breaks, Guest Tour, Poster Reception, and Banquet. Nonregistered guests may purchase individual tickets for the following events: President's Reception, Guest Tour, Poster Reception, and Banquet.

### **APMS First Annual Photo Contest**

The APMS photo salon is a way to share the creative photographic interests of the APMS membership at the annual meeting. While in the field and lab, members are observing and recording interesting, colorful, and informative photographic images related to many aspects of aquatic plant management including all phases of aquatic plant life, ecological interactions with other flora and fauna, and plant management and control.

Rules/Instructions: Members may submit two unpublished digital photos in each of five categories dealing with some aspect of aquatic plant botany and/or aquatic plant management. The five categories include Scenic, Humorous, Management, Biology/Ecology, and People. Awards will be given in each category.

The photos entered must be taken by an APMS member in good standing (membership dues paid). The photos can be cropped and/or color adjusted but otherwise digitally unaltered. If photos include the image of a person or persons, the photographer must obtain a signed photographic release from those individuals allowing their images to be used. Digitally scanned film images are acceptable. Acceptability of photos submitted to the photo salon will be determined by the Photo Salon Committee. Their decision is final.

Submission to the Photo Salon Committee will be by Email. Upon submission of photos to the APMS Photo Salon Committee, the photographer gives without compensation, the APMS all rights to copy, display, publish or use for any society purpose, as approved by the Executive Board, the images submitted. The photographer retains all use rights outside of those granted to the APMS.

Photos must be submitted digitally by June 1, 2007. Each submission E-mail must include the full name, address, daytime phone number, and E-mail address of the submitting member. Each submitted digital photo must be in JPEG format. Send no more than two attached photos with each E-mail submission because exceedingly large files may not be accepted by the receiving server. Oral and Poster Presentations of original research on the biology or ecology of aquatic and wetland plants, control methods (biological, chemical, cultural, mechanical) for invasive exotic or nuisance native plant species, and restoration projects involving wetland or aquatic plants are solicited.

The Society encourages students that have conducted original research to present their findings and gain a valuable perspective on aquatic plant problems and various management applications throughout the U.S. The meeting locale in Nashville provides an excellent opportunity for students from much of the eastern U.S. to attend and present research on aquatic plant management in several diverse settings.

The APMS has a strong ethic of student support and all qualified attendees will be provided room accommodations (based on double occupancy) and waiver of registration fees. In addition, 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place prize money will be awarded in separate contests for *both* oral and poster presentations. 
